## Bicentenary Prizes

### Call for Applications

To celebrate the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the birth of Louis Pasteur a series of prestigious scientific prizes will be awarded for achievements that capture the Pasteur ethos (“*l’esprit Pasteur*”). These achievements should be in one or more of the fields of biomedical research, public health, or innovation.

#### SENIOR LP200 PRIZE

This prize is open to all heads of senior research units (U10) at the Institut Pasteur.

The laureate will receive € 5.000 for him(her)self and € 45.000 for his/her future research.

#### JUNIOR LP200 PRIZE

This prize is open to all heads of junior research groups and units, core facilities and innovation laboratories (G5, U5, etc.) at the Institut Pasteur.

The laureate will receive € 5.000 for him(her)self and € 20.000 for his/her future research.

#### PASTEUR NETWORK LP200 PRIZE

This prize is open to all heads of research units (except for those based in the Institut Pasteur Paris) located in an institution that is part of the Pasteur Network. The laureate will receive € 5.000 for him(her)self and € 45.000 for his/her future research.

#### PASTEUR ALUMNI LP200 PRIZES

To be eligible for this prize alumni must have been trained at the Institut Pasteur for at least two years (not necessarily consecutively) and currently be affiliated with a research institute, university, non-governmental organizations (NGO), etc. anywhere in the world but not in the Pasteur Network.

The Pasteur Alumni LP200 prize will be awarded in each of the following categories:

- **Senior Pasteur Alumni LP200 Prize:**  
The eligible candidate should have left the Institut Pasteur more than 20 years ago. The laureate of the senior prize will receive € 5.000 for him(her)self and € 45.000 for his/her future research.
- **Junior Pasteur Alumni LP200 Prize:**  
The junior prize will be awarded to a PI who left the Institut Pasteur more than 8 years ago. The laureate will receive € 5.000 for him(her)self and € 20.000 for his/her future research.

A single laureate in each of the five prize categories will be selected by an *ad hoc* international jury that will be chaired by Prof. Pascale Cossart, Secrétaire perpétuel honoraire de l’Académie des sciences.
